WHEREAS, C. C. Gunter and W. H. Willimon, both of
Greenville, S. C.

did on the 15th day of September, 1938, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Willimon Gin, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Fork Shoals Road, Greenville
County, South Carolina.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is Gin cotton and to buy
and sell cotton and cotton seed.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand (\$1,000.00)

payable in cash. Dollars,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is ten (10)
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 15th day of September, 1938
at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

C. C. Gunter and W. H. Willimon

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President W. H. Willimon
as Vice-President, C. C. Gunter; as Secretary, C. C. Gunter
as Treasurer, W. H. Willimon

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully
complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed
having been paid to the treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in.....

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the
