WHEREAS, Jay H. Young and Mae Pepper Riordan, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 15th day of March, 1939, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Jay's Flowers, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is a wholesale and retail business engaged in the selling of flowers and floral articles and in doing other things necessarily incident to or properly connected with a wholesale and retail floral business

Automobile and truck, merchandis and accounts receivable Seven Thousand (\$7,000.00) Dollars in cash.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars,

payable Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars in fixtures and equipment,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Fifteen Hundred (1500) of the par value of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 15th day of March, 1939, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

Jay H. Young and Mae Pepper Riordan

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Jay H. Young as Vice-President, Jay H. Young; as Secretary, Mae Pepper Riordan as Treasurer, Mae Pepper Riordan

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

The Greenville News
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
