the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the
said Paul B. Cushman

"All that tract or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, near the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, in the village known as East Summit View, on the north side of South Street.

Beginning at an iron pin at the Eastern boundary line of lots heretofore conveyed by S. C. Stover to J. P. Stover and shown on Plat made by J. S. Rogers, March 20, 1910, and running thence with said South Street in southeasterly direction 60 feet to an iron pin; thence in a northerly direction about 150 feet to the back line of Lot No. 11 as shown on said Plat; thence with the back line of Lot Nos 10 and 11 in a southwesterly direction 70 feet to corner of Lot No. 1; thence with the line of Lot No. 1 in a southerly direction 140 feet to the beginning corner."
