I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation

on or about the 7th day of April in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty seven exhibited its complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against William Whitelaw Smith, Jr., and Hiram C. Chastain

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One hundred and nofies (\$100.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation.

All that tract or parcel of land containing Eighty one and 4/10 (81.4) acres, more or less, in Calhoun Township of Greenville County, South Carolina, known as the Poore Place, located on the Groves Creek Road about 2 miles from Pelzer, on waters of Groves Creek bounded on the north by lands of Burdett; on the east by Groves Creek; on the south by lands of J. S. Smith; on the west by lands of Chastain and J. A. Smith; and having the following courses and distances according to survey and plat of H. A. Ellis, Surveyor, April 1931.
