TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, E. INMAN, Master In and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, L. M. Bauskett

on or about the 22nd day of September in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty-two exhibited his complaint in the Court of Common Pleas for the County aforesaid, against Maud Bitts, formerly Maud Carter

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 18th day of October, 1932, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by E. INMAN, Master In and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate

for the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, being at that price the highest bidder therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said Eva Goffey Williams

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Eva Goffey Williams

All that lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, in the West of the City of Greenville on the north side of Wilkins Street, containing $\frac{336}{100}$ of an acre, more or less, having the following notes and bounds:

Beginning at a stone on Wilkins Street and running thence N. 66° 3.61 Chains to a peach tree 3 7/8; thence S. 5.68 links to a stone 3 7/8; thence S. 72° 3.77 to a stone 3 7/8; thence E. 70 links to the beginning corner, the same fully described by a plat made by W. A. Hudson, Surveyor, March 16, 1891.
