NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said The Penn Mutual Life Insurance Company,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said The Penn Mutual Life Insurance Company

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as Lot No. 63 (and a part of Lot No. 63) of the Overbrook Property, according to a plat and survey recorded in R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book 4, page 261, having the following mates and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin corner of Lot No. 63 and running thence with Overbrook Road S. 84-3 W. 30 feet to iron pin; thence with said road S. 78-33 W. 60 ft. to iron pin; thence still with said Road S. 31-49 W. 30 feet to iron pin; thence with Overbrook Circle S. 38-11 W. 60 feet to iron pin; thence still with said Overbrook Circle S. 39-35 W. 60.7 feet to iron pin; corner of lot No. 64; thence with line of Lot No. 64 S. 78-47 W. 146.4 foot to iron pin; corner of Lot No. 62; thence along a 10 ft. alley and rear line of Lot No. 62 S. 78-47 E. 13 ft. to a stake; thence N. 9-13 W. 173 ft. to the beginning corner.
