Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars,
to me paid by the said *H. P. Lanford*

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the
said *H. P. Lanford.*

"All that certain parcel and tract of land lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Highland Township, on South side of Fortenberry's Beaverdam Creek and having the following metes and bounds: Beginning on a persimmon tree near Rev. F. L. Turner's running thence S. 30 1/4 W. 13.40 chs. to a stone 3x2x0 M.; thence S. 22 1/4 E. 11.16 chs. to a persimmon near the creek opposite the mouth of Fish Branch; up the said branch to a black gum; thence S. 75 E. 10.00 chs. to a stake 3x2x2 M.; thence S. 30 W. 11.00 to a stone 3x2x2 M. on original line; thence S. 64 E. 6.43 chs. to a Spanish Oak tree; thence N. 39 1/4 E. 20.50 chs. to a pine 3x2x0 M.; thence N. 15 1/4 W. 40.30 chs. to the beginning corner, adjoining lands of Rev.
