All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land, in the Town of West Greenville and being in the County and State aforesaid, at the corner of Queen and Roe Streets with the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a stake on Roe Street at corner of Queen Street, and running thence west 103 feet; thence south 60 feet; thence east 103 feet; thence north 60 feet to the beginning corner. This lot being a subdivision of lots 65 and 66 of Burlington Heights, and being the same lot of land deeded to Lottie R. Turner by Rebecca C. Neal by deed dated September 12, 1923, and recorded in office of P. M. C. for Greenville County Vol. 105, Page 217.
