All that certain tract of land containing 119 acres, more or less, known as the T. T. Thompson homeplace, in Butler Township, of Greenville County, State of South Carolina, located on the Anderson Bridge Road, 9 miles S. W. from Greer, on waters of Enoree River, and now in the possession of the said T. T. Thompson, bounded on the north by lands of Mrs. L. R. Watson and Bud Ford; on the East by lands of Elford Thompson; on the South by the Watson land and the lands of Tom Anderson Estate; and on the West by lands of Claude Neely Estate and J. E. Summey. Said tract of land is particularly described according to a plat prepared by H. S. Brockman, Surveyor, on the 13th day of June, 1934, as follows, to-wit: -

Beginning at an iron pin on the Greenville-Anderson Bridge Road, northwestern corner of said tract, and running thence S. 51 degrees and 42 minutes E. 1.51 chs. to point on old road; thence S. 50 degrees and 36 minutes East 3.03 chs. to bend; thence South 55 degrees and 47 minutes East 2.77 chs. to bend; thence South 42 degrees and 21 minutes East 3.45 chs. to stone; thence North 85 degrees and 37 minutes East 9.30 chs. to stone-oak stump; thence North 57 degrees and 52 minutes East 1.51 chs. to stone; thence N. 38 degrees and 46 minutes East 3.85 chs. to angle; thence N. 59 degrees and 32 minutes East 1.66 chs. to angle; thence North 21 degrees and 52 minutes E. 1.89 chs. to angle; thence N. 31 degrees and 2 minutes E. 1.59 chs. to head of branch; thence down said branch as a line the following measurements; N. 17 degrees and 52 minutes E. 2.66 chs.; N. 24 degrees and 42 minutes E. 2.54 chs. North 55 degrees and 42 minutes E. 1.17 chs. N. 11 degrees and 32 minutes E. 2.16 chs. N. 39 degrees and 12 minutes E. 1.76 chs.; N. 54 degrees and 33 minutes E. 2.26 chs. N. 35 degrees and 32 minutes E. 3.66 chs. to an iron pin; thence leaving said branch S. 64 degrees and 45 minutes E. 3.70 chs. to a post oak; thence S. 55 degrees and 30 minutes E. 18.85 chs. to a post oak; thence S. 48 degrees and 45 minutes W. 27.44 chs. to an iron pin; thence S. 56 degrees and 30 minutes West 17.44 chs. to a stone; thence N. 67 degrees West 9.75 chs. to a post oak; thence S. 44 degrees and 45 minutes W. 20.07 chs. to a stone; thence N. 3 degrees and 15 minutes E. 11.50 chs. to a stone; thence N. 41 degrees 45 minutes, W. 9.85 chs. to a stone; thence N. 37 degrees and 15 minutes E. 21.44 chs. to the beginning corner.

Reserving unto myself, however, the possession, control and use of the above described property for the term of my natural life. It is understood and agreed that as part consideration for this conveyance, the grantees herein named are to support the grantor for the term of his natural life, providing him with food, clothing, and other necessaries of life and a home in which to live for said term.
