at and before the sealing of these presents by H.K.Gilkey

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said
H.K.Gilkey, her heirs and assigns forever.

All that piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in County of
Greenville, State of South Carolina, and in Glassy Mountain Township, on the headwaters of
Barton's Creek of Tyger River, and according to survey and plat made by Weldon Willis, on record,
having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at sourwood at large road on Old Road, Pruitt's line, and running thence along
said Old Road in a Southernly direction, 150 Poles to Rock near the Western side of said Road;
thence N. 75 W. 109 Poles, crossing another Road to a Rock; thence S. 20 E. 135 Poles to Rock;
thence N. 41 1/2 E. 28 Poles to Dogwood; thence N. 78 E. 122 Poles to Stake on top of Ridge; thence
along top of Ridge in an easternly direction, 86 Poles to point on Ridge; thence N. 35 E. 44
Poles to Point in Road; thence N. 20 E. 32 Poles to Point in middle of branch; thence, crossing
branch and along another branch in a northeasternly direction, to point where ditch empties into
branch a distance of 19 poles; thence along said ditch as the line, a distance of 26 Poles in
a northernly direction, to point on branch; thence along said branch in a Northwesternly
direction, 42 Poles to point on said branch; thence N. 85 W. 22 Poles to point on Ridge; thence
along the top of this Ridge, 158 Poles to Point on Road; thence along said Road, 34 Poles, to
point on Pruitt line; thence along said Pruitt line, S. 50 W. 42 Poles to the beginning point,
the Sourwood at large rock on road; bounded by lands now or formerly belonging to J. P. Smith,
Mrs. Lyda, Hamp Turner, and others, containing Two Hundred and Fifty (250) acres, more or less
and being known as the Samuel Pittman land, et al.
