(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

Mrs. Amelia W. Blassingame:

① All those certain pieces, parcels or lots of land in State and County aforesaid, on branch waters of Reedy River, described as the Blassingame Land according to survey of same made by Dalton and Neves, Engineers, June 1937 and being more particularly designated on said survey plat as Lots Nos. 1, ② 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, ③ 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 of said Blassingame land and being the remaining portion of a tract of thirty four and one-half acres, more or less, conveyed to the grantor by E. Inman, Master, by his deed dated February 1, 1937, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 183, page 199. *See 5/117*

④ Also, all that piece, parcel or lot of land in State and County aforesaid, on Reedy River, near the City of Greenville, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin on Branch at corner of H. T. Cook land, and running thence with the branch as a line 31.25 to a stone on Reedy River; thence down the river to a stone on line of D. T. Smith lands; thence S. 65 W. 24.65 to a stone at corner of D. T. Smith line; thence N. 26 3/4 W. 31 to stone; thence N. 62 1/4 E. 9.75 to a cherry; thence N. 44 1/2 W. 19.75 to a stone; thence N. 63 E. 6.10 to a stone; thence N. 48 3/4 E. 8.25 to an iron pin; thence S. 45 1/2 E. 2.15 to an iron pin; thence S. 45 3/4 W. 9.22 to a stone; thence N. 36 W. 9.55 to an iron pin; thence N. 45 3/4 E. 1.10 to iron pin on branch, corner of H. T. Cook line the point of beginning, said tract containing 65.20 acres, more or less, and being the same tract conveyed to J. T. Blassingame by Benjamin A. Cook by deed dated January 13, 1912, and being the second described parcel in deed of E. Inman, Master, to L. H. Stringer which is recorded in Deed Book 183, page 199, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County.
