TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the grantee hereinabove named, and his heirs and assigns forever.

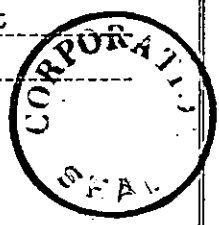
