FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is GREENVILLE BROADCASTING COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to acquire, own, and operate a radio broadcasting station; to make contracts for the sale of advertising and radio broadcasting programs; to acquire, own, buy, sell, lease, and convey land, real estate, radio stations, and any and all property usable in connection therewith and to transact any and all other business incidental to or connected with the operation of a radio broadcasting station.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00)

payable in cash. Dollars,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One hundred and fifty (150) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 4th day of March, 1940, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:  
G. P. Stanley and Clarence H. Calhoun.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President G. P. Stanley  
as Vice-President, Clarence H. Calhoun; as Secretary, G. P. Stanley  
as Treasurer, Clarence H. Calhoun.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
