WHEREAS, W. Frank Hipp and Wyatt Aiken, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 25th day of March, 1932, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is LIBERTY BROADCASTING COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is own, buy, sell, lease real estate and personal property, improve, sub-divide and develop real estate; to borrow money by way of mortgage or otherwise on any property owned by said corporation; to deal generally in both real estate and personal property; to own, manage, control lease and/or operate a radio broadcasting station with the usual powers of such station, to broadcast weather reports, market information, educational programs and all forms of general and commercial programs, and all powers usual to radio broadcasting stations; to buy, sell, own and/or lease electrical and radio equipment and apparatus.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P.
