FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is THE WOODSIDE REALTY COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S., C.,

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, sell, trade, improve, subdivide, mortgage and handle real estate in such manner and with such powers as are ordinarily vested in and incident to a real estate business under laws now existing or which hereafter may be conferred upon corporations. To act as agent or broker in the management of property for individuals and corporations. To make, endorse, and guarantee notes, bonds, real estate mortgages and other evidences of debt. To borrow and loan money, pledging or requiring security therefor, or on open account. To acquire and own stock in other corporations and to acquire, purchase, cancel, redeem and reissue its own stock so far as may be permitted by law. To establish branches in the United States and elsewhere.

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville,

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
