All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, just beyond the corporate limits of the City of Greenville and lying between the Woodside and Brandon Mills, and known and designated as Lot No. 26 on a plat of that body of land known as Perry Ave. annex; said lot having a frontage of 50 feet on the south side of Perry Avenue Extension and a depth of 140 feet extending back to Branwood Ave., fronting on said Street 50 feet and containing 7000 square feet, more or less, and having the courses, distances and specified in plat of said Perry Ave. Annex, drafted by W. D. Neves, Eng., in March 1912, and duly recorded in the R. M. C. Office for the County and State aforesaid, in Plat Book "A" at pages 278 and 279. Being the same lot of land conveyed to J. W.
