CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

WHEREAS, J. A. White, Slater, S. C.
R. P. Alexander Greenville, S. C.
Frank Roberts Slater, S. C.

two or more of the officers or agents appointed to supervise or manage the affairs of Slater Community Association

which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 16th day of June, A. D. 1941, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, That said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST. Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND. The name of the proposed Corporation is Slater Community Association.

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville

FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is

To acquire or erect and to equip, maintain, manager and operate a clinic or hospital, and to provide medical, surgical and/or dental aid and treatment for sick or injured persons; to promote such educational, recreational and welfare activities and cooperative enterprises as may be determined to be for the best interest of the employees of S. Slater & Sons, Inc., and the residents of Slater Village, including, if so determined, maintaining, operating and managing gymnasiums, playgrounds, athletic fields and teams, theaters, lectures and classes for instruction in health, hygiene and other matters, and for entertainment, with the right to buy, sell and deal in commodities for the convenience, use and benefit of the employees of S. Slater & Sons, Inc., and the residents of said village, including coal, wood and other fuel, cold drinks, sandwiches, cakes and candies, and other goods and merchandise, and to operate a commissary; and generally to do any and everything necessary, expedient or incidental to the operation of said activities. This corporation is organized for the purpose of promoting the general welfare of the employees of S. Slater & Sons, Inc., and the residents of Slater, S.C. and is not for the purpose of gain or profit. Any receipts in excess of expenses in connection with the purchase, erection and maintenance and/or operation of the aforesaid activities will be applied toward carrying out the purposes of this organization and the promotion of the public health and welfare of the employees of S. Slater & Sons, Inc., and the residents of Slater Village.

FIFTH. The names and residences of all Managers, Trustees, Directors or other officers are as follows:

SIXTH. That they desire to be incorporated. In perpetuity.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested, by Chapter ~~158~~ ¹⁵⁸ Article ~~III~~ ^{III} Code of ~~1932~~ ¹⁹³² and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby declare the said organization to be a body politic and corporate, with all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the limitations and liabilities, conferred by said Chapter ~~158~~ ¹⁵⁸ Article ~~III~~ ^{III} Code of ~~1932~~ ¹⁹³² and Acts amendatory thereto.
