Beginning at a White Oak, and running thence S. 89 E. 20.00 to Spanish Oak; thence N. 12 E. 14.73 to stone; thence N. 83=3/4 E. 29.38 to Poplar; thence N. 77 E. 16.50 to Hickory; thence N. 83=3/4 E. Crossing North Fork of Saluda River 39.00 to stone; thence N. 7=1/3 W. 15.50 to stake; thence S. 83=1/3 W., crossing said Saluda River, 98.50 to stone; thence S. 12=3/4 W. 31.75 to the beginning.
