I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, Thermuthis D. Trammell, individually and as administratrix of the Estate of J. D. Trammell, deceased, Rozelle Thompson, C. G. Trammell, J. D. Trammell, Jr., Virginia Willis, Joe Trammell,

on or about the 27 day of Oct. in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and forty-two exhibited their complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Robert Trammell and Louise Trammell

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 4 day of Nov., 1942, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, to C. C. Robinson

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said C. C. Robinson

All the undivided right, title and interest of Thermuthis D. Trammell, Rozelle Thompson, C. G. Trammell, J. D. Trammell, Jr., Virginia Willis, Joe Trammell, Robert Trammell and Louise Trammell:

All that certain tract of land situate in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, on North Saluda River, adjoining lands now or formerly of John Goodwin, Mrs. Sarah Gillespie and others, and being the tract of land of which Benjamin P. Trammell died seized and possessed, containing 205 acres, more or less. Being the same property conveyed to B. P. Trammell by John H. Goodwin by deed dated Jan. 21, 1880, said deed being recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book KK at page 201.
