All our rights, titles, and undivided interests in and to all that certain tract or parcel of land, situate, lying, and being, in the State and County aforesaid on the West side of the east fork of Thompson's Beaverdam Creek - Beginning at a stone 3x on said creek and running thence N. 87½ W. 9.40 to a stone 3x South 5.64 to a stone 3x; thence S. 77½ W. 6.77 to a stone 3x; thence S. 4 E. 20.06 to a stone 3x; thence S. 37 E. 10.96 to a Red Oak 3x; thence S. 78 ¾ E. 10.50 to a maple 3x on the bank of Beaverdam Creek; thence up said creek with the meanderings to the beginning stone corner, containing forty nine and one half (49.5) acres, more or less, it being our intention to convey herein all interest that we acquired in the above described tract as heirs of John F.
