HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said

Eddie Grace Chamblee Woods

"All the right, title and interest, the same being an undivided two-ninths (2/9)
interest in fee of Minnie Belle Chamblee and William Marshall Chamblee, in and to all that
certain piece, parcel or tract of land in Fairview Township, Greenville County, State of
South Carolina, containing 137 acres, more or less, and known as Lot Nos. 2, 3 and 4 of
the subdivision of the M. P. Nash estate, bounded by lands of W. E. Chapman, Pratt Balcomb,
Rabon Creek, W. S. Adair, et al; and being the same tract of land conveyed to F. W. Welborn
and A. H. Balcomb by C. P. Armstrong, W. W. Kellett, and J. W. Fowler by deed dated January 1,
1926, to which reference is hereby made for a fuller description of said premises."
