WHEREAS, N. A. Collins and O. P. Smith, of Greer, S. C.

and

Jas. M. Richardson, of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 21st day of September, 1922, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greer Oil Mill and Feed Company.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greer, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is own and operate oil mills and ginneries, buy, sell and manufacture cotton seed and their by-products.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars, payable in cash.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One Thousand (1,000) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, pursuant to three days' public notice in The Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, at a meeting of the subscribers held on September 2nd, 1922 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: N. A. Collins, O. P. Smith, James M. Richardson, S. C. Berry, I. F. Reese, W. F. Mitchell and Walter De Sheals.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Jas. M. Richardson; as Vice-President, N. A. Collins; as Secretary, O. P. Smith; as Treasurer, Jas. M. Richardson.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article I, of the Civil Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1912 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of... NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
