All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

on the West side of the White Horse Road (also known as Saluda Dam road), and containing approximately six (6) acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the White Horse Road at corner of lot now or formerly belonging to Julia S. Freeman, which point is approximately 1209.4 feet northwest from the intersection of a cross road and White Horse Road, about 3½ miles from Greenville County, Court House, and running thence along the line of said Julia Freeman lot, S. 50 W. 1706 feet, more or less, to a stake in a ditch bank on line of Southern Railway right-of-way; thence along the line of the right-of-way of said railway in a westerly direction to the culvert at branch; thence up said branch 70 feet to an iron pin, corner of other land of the grantors, S. 66 E. 335 feet, more or less, to an iron pin, joint rear corner of tracts formerly owned by Anna Cossett and B. S. Freeman, and now owned by the grantors; thence N. 50 E. 1706 feet to an iron pin on west side of White Horse road; thence along said White Horse Road, S. 50 E. 134.3 feet to the beginning corner, and being all of the first described tract of land, and a portion of the second described tract of land conveyed to us by Anna Gossett by deed dated November 18, 1936 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, in Vol. 192, page 8".
