to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee (s) hereinafter named (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto BARNEY L. BABB, his heirs and assigns forever:-

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being at the Northeast corner of the intersection of Crane Avenue and Forest Circle, near the City of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, being known and designated as Lot No. 21 on map of Victor Monaghan Company Development No. 1 Property, made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, December, 1941, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book M, at page 39, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northwest side of Forest Circle, at joint front corner of Lots 20 and 21, and running thence with the line of Lot 20 N. 30-45 W. 200 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 59-15 W. 97.7 feet to an iron pin on the Northeast side of Crane Avenue; thence along the Northeast side of Crane Avenue S. 24-27 E. 176.1 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing with Crane Avenue along a curved line to an iron pin on the Northwest side of Forest Circle (the chord of which is S. 72-36 E. 33.4 feet); thence with Forest Circle N. 59-15 E. 95 feet to the beginning corner. This property is conveyed subject to the restrictive covenants which are set forth in instrument dated February 20th, 1942, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Deed Book 243, at page 146.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the grantee (x) hereinafter named, and his heirs and assigns forever.

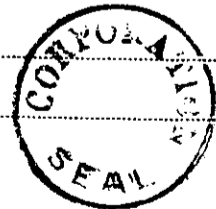
