HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said

J. W. Norwood, Individually and as Trustee

"All that tract containing 40 acres, more or less, conveyed by B. F. Martin, June 8, 1923, to the American Bank & Trust Co., by deed recorded in Plat Book F, at Page 140; all of said land has been reconveyed by the said American Bank & Trust Co., except 8 acres, more or less, appearing on said plat as Lots Nos. 5, 16, 88, 99, 100, 135, 136, 137, 138, 139, 140, 141, 142, 143, 144, 153, 154, and the triangle lot shown on said plat as bounded by Anderson Road, Walker Street, and Washington Avenue."

This deed is made under Order of his Honor, G. Dewey Oxner, dated October 9, 1943, to correct the description made in the prior deed of the Master, in certain particulars as recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 140, at Page 46.
