T. D. Pressley, his heirs and assigns forever;

A certain lot or parcel of land situated in Greenville County, South Carolina and lying on branch waters of Reedy River adjoining lands of R. L. Meares, James Tollerson and others and has the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a stone near the residence of J. L. Gray, running thence with Gray N. 70 3/4 W. 34.24 to a stone Tollerson's corner; thence N. 49 1/2 E. 9.42 to a stake in road 40 links west of center of bridge; thence S. 32 1/2 E. 6.50 to stone in road; thence N. 23 1/4 E. 26.26 to a stone on R. L. Meares Line; thence with Meares line S. 64 1/2 E. 15.36 to a stone by 3 cedars; thence S. 87 E. 14.62 to a stone; thence S. 18 W. 1885 to a stone; thence S. 3/4 W. 10.60 to a stone; thence S. 81 1/2 W. 10.76 to beginning corner containing one hundred and nine acres, more or less, the same being conveyed to S. M. Meares by J. A. Adams April 23, 1902, according to a plat made by J. A. Adams, Surveyor, April 24, 1902.
