SEPARATION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Hollis Peterson and Pearl Stone Peterson, both of the County and State aforesaid, were intermarried in said County and State on the 9th day of June, 1940, and ever since that date have been, and are now, husband and wife.

And Whereas, during the latter part of January or the first part of February 1941 differences arose between the said Hollis Peterson and Pearl Stone Peterson of such a nature as to render their living together as husband and wife intolerable and burdensome, and as a result thereof the said Hollis Peterson and Pearl Stone Peterson separated, and since that time have been and now are living separate and apart from each other.

And Whereas, a reconciliation between the parties seems impossible on account of the differences heretofore and now existing between them.

And Whereas, the parties have mutually agreed that the separation between them now existing shall continue and that the said parties will henceforth remain separate and apart from each other.

And Whereas, no children have been born of the aforementioned union and each of the parties hereto is capable of self-support.

Now in mutual agreement the parties hereto agree and contract to the following effects;

(1) That the separation now existing between the parties hereto shall continue and henceforth the said Hollis Peterson and Pearl Stone Peterson shall continue to live separate and apart from each other as fully and to all intents and purposes as if no bonds of matrimony existed between them.

(2) The said Pearl Stone Peterson does hereby release the said Hollis Peterson, his person and his property from any and all claims for support and maintenance of the said Pearl Stone Peterson and does hereby release and relinquish all her dower rights, property rights and rights of whatever nature and kind growing out of the marital relationship, which the said Pearl Stone Peterson now has or may hereafter have against the property, real and personal, of the said Hollis Peterson, and she does further release him from and of all and every right of action, claim or demand against his person or property that she might or could have by reason of the marital relationship.

(3) That the said Hollis Peterson does hereby release the said Pearl Stone Peterson, her person and her property, of all and every right in her property, both real and personal, and against her person which he has or might have against the said Pearl Stone Peterson or her property by reason of the said marital relationship.

(4) That the parties hereto shall henceforth hold, use, enjoy and dispose of his or her separate property or estate independent of and free from all claims of the other and each may contract and be contracted with, purchase, sell, mortgage, convey or otherwise dispose of his or her separate property, real and personal, now owned or hereafter acquired independent of the other and without the consent, written or oral, of the other, to the full extent of now and in the further as if the parties had never been married.

(5) That neither of the parties hereto is to interfere with or molest the other in his or her activities, business or personal.
