day of May, 1944 and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN, Master in and for
the County aforesaid, to Prelo Hood
for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgement Roll No. #9939)

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid
decree, and upon receipt of \$1666.67
HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said Prelo Hood

All the right, title and interest of the minor Defendants, James Edward Hall and Roy
Preston Hall, the same being an undivided two-thirds interest in and to the following des-
cribed real estate:

"All that certain piece, parcel and tract of land lying and being situate in Grove Town-
ship, Greenville County and State of South Carolina, and being the same tract of land conveyed
to J. E. Hall by R. B. Gresham by his deed dated Sept. 20, 1934, and recorded in the office
of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Book 172, Page 371 and containing according to that
deed 44.75 acres, more or less, and specifically described according to a new survey as follows,
to-wit: Bounded on the North by lands of John Brown, on the east by B. B. Young, on the south
by the Ed Garrison estate and on the west by the Ed Garrison estate and John Brown. Beginning
at a pin in the center of paved road at B. B. Young's corner and running thence along said paved
road S. 88-32 W. 740 feet to iron pin; thence along dirt road S. 20-33 W. 749 feet to iron
pin thence due west 864.4 feet to an iron pin at stone; thence S. 20-47 E. 1056.5 feet to pin
in center of Georgia Road; thence N. 76-01 E. 132 feet to intersection of Georgia Road and a
dirt road; thence along Georgia Road, N. 78-30 E. 577 feet to curve in road; thence continuing
along said road S. 83-42 E. 213 feet to pin in road; thence N. 22-14 E. 660 feet to an iron
