All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, lying north of Enoree river and on waters of same, beginning at a stone, thence N. 43 W. 8.11 to a stone, thence S. 40 1/2 W. 13.75 to a stone, thence S. 48 1/4 E. 7.14 to a stone, thence N. 44 3/4 E. 13.75 to the beginning corner, containing 11.28 acres, according to plat of J. E. Freeman, dated Oct. 2, 1943, being the same tract deeded to Nancy E. Lewis by deed dated Nov. 13, 1895 and recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book CCC, page 9.

Also, all that piece, parcel or tract of land containing thirteen (13) acres, according to plat of W. A. Hester made March 22, 1922, a dividing line having been run by same surveyor June 12, 1943, carving the said thirteen acres out of a thirty-four acre tract, the same thirteen acres being more particularly described according to said plat as follows: Beginning at an I.
