day of X, 19X, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

NOW, THEREFORE, now All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of
Seventeen Hundred Twenty-five (\$1725.00) Dollars,

to me paid by the said George H. Lindsey

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the
said George H. Lindsey

"All that certain piece, parcel and tract of land situate, lying and being in the
State of South Carolina, Greenville County on waters of South Tiger River and in Highland Township:
Beginning at an iron pin, corner of John Taylor estate, thence N. 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 6.50 to
stone; thence N. 3 E. 6.36 to stake in road; thence N. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 2.90 to stone; thence N. 20 W. 4.25
to stone; thence N. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 9.26 to stone; thence S. 83 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 5.90 to stake in branch; thence down and
with the branch as a line to its confluence with another branch; thence up that branch as a line
16.90 to stone at corner Gid. Moon; thence S. 8 E. 22.70 to stone; thence S. 65 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 23.27 to State
Road; thence along road in a southeasterly direction 9.05 to a stake; thence N. 65 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 21.50 to
