All that piece, parcel or tract of land containing 20 acres more or less as by recent survey of same by W. M. Nash, Reg. Sur. and surveyed as follows: Beginning at Stone old and up by W. M. Gray and Lula Sullivan Thence N. 84 E. 9.85 to Poplar Sprout on old stump; Thence N. 4 W. 10.40 to I. P. along Edwards line; S. 85 W. 18.83 to Iron Pin; Thence along the Adjer Lee Stewart line S. 2 1/4 E. 8.50 Stk on W. M. Gray line; S. 84 E. 9.90 to begin Stone Bounded on North by John Stewart; on East by Edwards; on South by Lula Sullivan and W. M. Gray; and west by Adjer Lee Stewart.
