WHEREAS, George H. Edwards and Martha S. Edwards,  
both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 25th day of April, 1945, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is QUALITY TEXTILES, INC.,

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to manufacture and sell at wholesale cotton and rayon goods, fabrics and garments; to manufacture and sell notions and kindred merchandise; to wholesale manufactured garments and other goods, wares and merchandise and to do any and all things incidental to the carrying on of said business and generally to transact all business as may be permitted under the existing laws or which may hereafter be conferred upon such corporations by law.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars,  
payable in cash.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred and fifty (250) Dollars,  
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

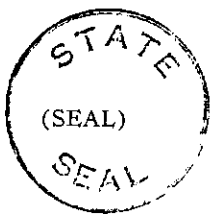
SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 17th day of April, 1945, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:  
George H. Edwards and Martha S. Edwards.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President George H. Edwards  
as Vice-President, Martha S. Edwards; as Secretary, Martha S. Edwards  
as Treasurer, George H. Edwards.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

The Greenville Piedmont  
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
