HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said Earl J. May and Mamie H. May

"All those two lots of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, known and designated as Lots Nos. 21 and 22, of Block K, of Riverside Land Company, said lots together fronting 85 feet on Highlawn Ave. with a depth along Pickens Street of 125 feet to an alley, being the same lots conveyed to R. N. Gallamore by Riverside Land Company by deed dated December 4, 1911, and recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book 2, Page 56."
