I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, Amos Pitman, et al,

on or about the 12th day of September in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and forty five exhibited their complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against

R. C. Pitman

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 15th day of October, 1945, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Theron E. Barton and William Morris Barton

for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgement Roll No. E-10412)

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, and upon receipt of \$1200.00

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said Theron E. Barton and William Morris Barton

"All that certain parcel and tract of land, situate, lying and being in South Carolina, Greenville County, Saluda Township, and having the following description:

BEGINNING at a chestnut stump near Beason place; thence North to a stone corner in Mill Creek; thence up said Creek to a stone corner in the Creek; thence North to Henry Pitman's stone corner; thence along Henry Pitman's line North to a bend in the road on stone corner; thence along the road North to J. H. Roe's stone corner; thence southwest along Roe's line to a rock shoals corner on White Oak in branch; thence along the branch South to the Creek; thence northwest along the creek to J. P. Pitman's rock corner; thence along J. P. Pitman's line to a rock corner and corner of the C. A. Fowler; thence with C. A. Fowler line to a rock corner on the south side of the Allen Knob; thence southeast to a rock corner; thence along Scoggins line to the rock corner; thence along Scoggins line southeast to a rock corner; thence southeast along Scoggins line to the Trammell land; thence southeast to a chestnut oak corner; thence south to the beginning chestnut stump, and containing one hundred fifty (150) acres, more or less, and bounded by lands now or formerly owned by C. A. Fowler, Scoggins and others."
