WHEREAS, J. B. Heafer, Jr., and J. D. Ragan,
both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 1st day of February, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Superior Gas Corporation

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to distribute and sell, retail and wholesale, liquefied petroleum gas and other hydrocarbons, crude petroleum and petroleum products, gas and electrical appliances, and all types and kinds of equipment pertaining thereto; to install and service these appliances and this equipment; and to acquire, own, exchange, lease and sell real estate.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Hundred Twenty Thousand (\$120,000.00)

payable in cash or its equivalent.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Eighteen Thousand (18,000) shares of Common Stock of the Par Value of Five (\$5.00) Dollars Three Hundred (300) Preferred stock of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 30th day of January, 1946, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: J. B. Heafer, Jr., J. B. Heafer, Sr., J. D. Ragan and G. P. Steadman, Jr.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President and Treasurer -- J. B. Heafer, Jr., as Vice-President, J. D. Ragan; as Secretary, J. B. Heafer, Sr. as Treasurer, -----

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of
NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
