All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Fairview Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

and in the Town of Fountain Inn being a portion of the same lot of land conveyed to L. P. Armstrong by J. W. Fowler by deed recorded in Vol. 19, page 245, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County and a portion of lot conveyed to L. P. Armstrong by J. A. Adams by deed bearing date of March 9, 1909 recorded in Vol. 210, at page 264. Said lot having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at the joint corner with building of the W. E. McKnight Estate on Main Street, running thence 144 feet, more or less, to a 20 foot alley, said alley having been conveyed by L. P. Armstrong to the Town of Fountain Inn; thence in a southerly direction approximately 26 feet to the joint corner with the lot of Stewart & Taylor; thence in an easterly direction approximately 144 feet along the joint line of the lot being conveyed herein and the Stewart & Taylor lot to Main Street; thence in a northerly direction along Main Street approximately 26 feet to the W. E. McKnight Estate corner and the beginning point. Said lot being bound on the east by Main Street, on the North by W. E. McKnight Estate lot, on the west by Alley and on the South by Stewart & Taylor building and lot.
