WHEREAS, by deed dated March 25, 1946, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, Book of Deeds 289, at page 327, T. J. McPherson conveyed to W. M. Shelton an undivided one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest in the property herein described, and by deed of even date, herewith, not yet recorded, Mary A. Johnson conveyed to W. M. in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Henry P. Willimon, his heirs and assigns, an undivided one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest in and to

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, Beginning at a stake on the south side of South Main Street 117 feet, 7 inches, southward from the southwest corner of Main and Broad Streets, and running thence southward along said Main Street 62 feet to an iron pin on the northeast corner of lot formerly owned by R. N. and J. D. Tannahill, thence turning to the right by an angle of 90 degrees, and running westward and parallel with Broad Street along the line of said Tannahill lot 170 feet to a stake on the northeast corner of said Tannahill lot and on the east side of an alley 11 feet 3 inches wide, which opens into Markley Alley on the south; thence turning to the right by an angle of 90 degrees and running along the east side of the alley first above mentioned and parallel with Main Street 62 feet to an iron pin on the corner of said alley and another alley which opens into Jackson Street; thence turning to the right at an angle of 90 degrees, and running eastward and parallel with Broad Street along the south side of alley last mentioned and along the south side of the lot of S. E. Bradshaw, et al, 170 feet to the beginning corner on Main Street.
