FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is retail jewelry, watches, diamonds,

silverware, radios, chinaware, electric appliances, optical goods, cameras and other kindred lines. Also to buy and sell real estate, borrow money on said real estate by way of mortgage, lend money on real estate, and to engage in a general real estate business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00)

payable Ten Thousand Dollars subscribed and paid in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred (200)

of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 4th day of May, 1946 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

Ned W. Cohen, Sidney Schleifstein and Ben Schleifstein

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Ned W. Cohen

as Vice-President, Sidney Schleifstein; as Secretary, Ben Schleifstein

as Treasurer, Ben Schleifstein

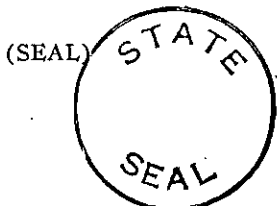
NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
