CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

WHEREAS, R. B. (BOB) JONES; BOB JONES, JR., AND R. K. JOHNSON,
ALL OF CLEVELAND, TENN.

two or more of the officers or agents appointed to supervise or manage the affairs of BOB JONES COLLEGE (now of Cleveland, Tenn., but to be removed to Greenville, S. C.)

which has been lawfully and regularly organized, did on the 23rd day of May, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That the said organization holds or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than as above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, That said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST. Their names and residences are as above given (but shortly to be at Greenville, S. C.)

SECOND. The name of the proposed Corporation is BOB JONES COLLEGE

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville, S. C. (College now at Cleveland, Tenn.; to be moved to Greenville in 1947)

FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is The general nature and object of the corporation shall be to conduct an institution of learning for the general education of youth in the essentials of culture and in the arts and sciences, giving special emphasis to the Christian religion and the ethics revealed in the Holy Scriptures, combating all atheistic, agnostic, pagan and so-called scientific adulterations of the Gospel, unqualifiedly affirming and teaching the inspiration of the Bible (both Old and New Testaments) the creation of man by the direct act of God; the incarnation and virgin birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ; His identification as the Son of God; His vicarious atonement for the sins of mankind by the shedding of His blood on the Cross; the resurrection of His body from the tomb; His power to save men from sin; the new birth through the regeneration by the Holy Spirit, and the gift of eternal life by the grace of God; with all of the rights, powers and privileges conferred, and subject to the conditions and limitations imposed, by Sections 8158 to 8167 of the Code of South Carolina, 1942.

Upon grant of authority by the F. C. C., to operate a radio station.

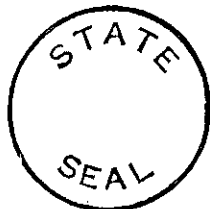

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested, by Chapter 158 Article III Code of 1942 and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby declare the said organization to be a body politic and corporate, with all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the limitations and liabilities, conferred by said Chapter 158 Article III Sections 8158-8159 and 8168, and Acts amendatory thereto.

GIVEN under my hand and the seal of the State, at Columbia, this 23rd day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-six and in the one hundred and forty-seventieth year of the Independence of the United States of America.
