All our undivided interests in and to all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing 19 acres, more or less, and being all the land owned by Wade Floyd in Greenville County at the time of his death, said land being shown as Tracts Nos. 9 and 10-B on Page B-3 of the County Block Book.

It is the intention of the sellers to convey unto the purchasers their two-thirds undivided interest in said land, free of encumbrance or lien. The sole surviving heirs at law of Wade Floyd, deceased, being the grantors herein and Daisy Floyd Gambrell. Daisy Floyd Gambrell and Ruth Floyd Smith being the sole heirs at law of Andrew Floyd, deceased, who died intestate in April, 1944.
