

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, } BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

WHEREAS, J. N. Sloan and Robert A. Dobson, Jr.
both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 27th day of April, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is S. & S. BUILDING COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to carry on and conduct a general contracting business, including the designing, constructing, enlarging, repairing, remodeling or otherwise engaging in any work upon buildings, roads, side-walks, highways, bridges or manufacturing plants; to engage in iron, steel, wood, brick, concrete, stone, cement, masonry and earth construction, and to execute contracts or to receive assignments of contracts therefor, or relating thereto; to manufacture and furnish the building materials and supplies connected herewith; to buy, sell, own, exchange, operate, mortgage, lease and manage real and personal property of all kinds both as to principal and agent and at either wholesale or retail; to do all things incident or necessary to such businesses and in general carry on any business not contrary to the laws of South Carolina, and to have and exercise all the powers, rights, and privileges conferred by the laws of the State of South Carolina upon corporations organized thereunder.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars,
of which \$5,000.00 has been subscribed and is payable at the call of the Board of Directors.

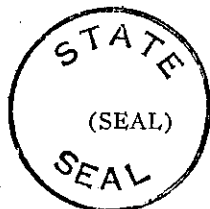
SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One hundred (100) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 26th day of April, 1946, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: J. N. Sloan, Rembert R. Stokes, Jr., H. G. Hudson, Robert A. Dobson, Jr., and R. R. Stokes.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President J. N. Sloan as Vice-President, Rembert R. Stokes, Jr.; as Secretary, Robert A. Dobson, Jr. as Treasurer, H. G. Hudson.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont Greenville a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
