did on the 28th day of June, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

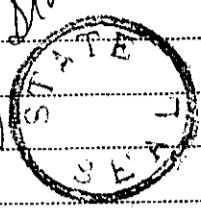
FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to operate a retail furniture store; to buy, sell, manufacture, import, export and generally to deal in home appliances, furniture, household and kindred furnishings and to carry on the business of interior decorating and furnishings of every nature and description; to buy, sell, own, exchange, operate, mortgage, lease and manage real and personal property of all kinds both as principal and agent and at either wholesale or retail; to do all things incident or necessary to such businesses and in general to carry on any business not contrary to the laws of the State of South Carolina, and to have and to exercise all the powers, rights, and privileges conferred by the laws of the State of South Carolina upon corporations organized thereunder.

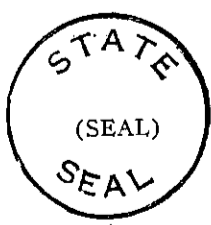

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in
