BEGINNING at an iron pipe on an unnamed street, said pipe being on line of Dunean Mills property, thence along said line N. 63-15 E. 155.5 feet to a stake; thence along back line of lots along other property of S. C. Mills S. 42-03 E. 34 feet to an iron pipe; thence S. 47-57 W. 150 feet to an iron pipe on an unnamed street; thence along said street N. 42-03 W. 75.2 feet to the beginning corner; and being part of the same land devised to the said Mrs. S. C. Mills by O. P. Mills, and being Lot. No. 1 of the subdivision of the property of Mrs. S. C. Mills situated near Dunean Mills.

Lots Nos. 11, 12 and 13 being described in the aggregate, as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Owens Street, joint corner of Lots Nos. 10 and 11, and running thence along joint line of said lots S. 14-24 W. 158.4 feet to an iron pin in line of other property of Dunean Mills, joint rear corner of Lots Nos. 10 and 11; thence along line of property of said Dunean Mills N. 80-01 W. 108 feet to an iron pin in rear line of Lot. No. 13; thence still with said Dunean Mills property S. 84-42 W. 22 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots Nos. 13 and 14; thence along joint line of said lots N. 3-25 E. 151.4 feet to an iron pin in the South side of Owens Street, joint corner of Lots Nos. 13 and 14; thence along the South side of Owens Street N. 88-04 E. 50 feet to an iron pin; thence still with the South side of said street S. 85-09 E. 55 feet; thence still with the South side of said street S. 77-54 E. 55 feet to the point of beginning.

Lots Nos. 15 and 16 being described in the aggregate as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Owens Street, joint corner of Lots Nos. 14 and 15, and running thence along joint line of said lots S. 2-47 W. 151.4 feet to an iron pin in line of property of Dunean Mills, joint rear corner of Lots Nos. 14 and 15; thence along line of said Dunean Mills property S. 84-42 W. 100 feet to an iron pin; thence still with line of property of Dunean Mills N. 2-47 E. 151.7 feet to an iron pin in the South side of Owens Street; thence along the South side of Owens Street N. 84-52 E. 100 feet to the point of beginning.
