WHEREAS, D. J. Barry and M. M. Jacobs,
both of 231 South La Salle Street, Chicago, Illinois,
did on the 22nd day of October, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration,
signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is SOUTHLAND DISTRIBUTING CO.
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.
FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is
To distribute, buy, sell, deal in, store, warehouse, export, manufacture, brew
malt, beers, ales, alcohol, and other spirituous, fermented and distilled products and by-products
thereof, and all kinds of brewery products and by-products thereof and all such other commodities
as are or may be handled, used and employed in and about such manufacture, distribution and sale;
to manufacture, buy, sell, deal in, distribute, warehouse and export malt, hops, cheese and malt
products, molasses and all other products used in connection with the conduct of the business of
brewers and maltsters; to grind, mill, and convert all kinds of grain and to manufacture, buy,
sell, deal in, distribute, store, warehouse and export all products and by-products produced,
used, sold or dealt in in connection with the conduct of the business of distributors, brewers and
maltsters; to carry on the business of hop merchants and growers, malt factors, bottlers, bottle
makers, bottle stopper makers, and dealers in aerated and mineral waters and other drinks, whether
alcoholic or non-alcoholic; to carry on the business of yeast dealers, grain dealers and dryers;
to carry on the business of distillers in all its branches and to manufacture, buy, sell and deal
in any and all such commodities and products as are or may be handled, used and employed in and
about such business; and to manufacture, buy, sell, deal in, distribute and store ice and refriger-
ated products.

To manufacture, purchase, or otherwise acquire, own, mortgage, pledge, sell,
assign and transfer, or otherwise dispose of, to invest, trade, deal in and deal with, goods,
wares and merchandise and personal property of every class and description.

To acquire, and pay for in cash, stock or bonds, of this corporation or otherwise,
the good will, rights, assets and property, and to undertake or assume the whole or any part of
the obligations or liabilities of any person, firm, association or corporation.

To acquire, hold, use, sell, assign, lease, grant licenses in respect of, mortgage,
or otherwise dispose of letters patent of the United States or any foreign country, patent rights,
licenses and privileges, inventions, improvements and processes, copyrights, trade-marks and trade
names relating to or useful in connection with any business of this corporation.

To purchase, hold, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose
of shares of the capital stock of, or any bonds, securities or evidences of indebtedness created
by any other corporation or corporations organized under the laws of this state or any other
state, country, nation or government, and while the owner thereof to exercise all the rights,
powers and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote.

To enter into, make and perform contracts of every kind and description with any
person, firm, association, corporation, municipality, county, state, body politic or government or
colony or dependency thereof.

To borrow money for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the corporation
and from time to time, without limit as to amount, to make, accept, endorse and issue promissory
notes, bonds and other evidences of debt and to secure the payment of any of its obligations by
mortgage or deed in trust on all of any of its property and franchises, both real and personal.

To have one or more offices, to carry on all or any of its operations and business
and without restriction or limit as to amount to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, own, mortgage,
sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of every class and description
in South Carolina and any of the states, districts, territories or colonies of the United States,
and in any and all foreign countries, subject to the laws of such state, district, territory,
colony or country. In general, to carry on any other business in connection with the foregoing,
whether manufacturing or otherwise and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws
