

TITLE TO REAL ESTATE

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, } BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

WHEREAS, S. Augustus Black and William L. Cain,  
both of Columbia, S. C.

did on the 31st day of October, 19 46, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is R. S. Evans Greenville, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is 515 Buncombe Street, Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is the buying, selling and otherwise dealing in automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, trailers, parts, materials, supplies and accessories, both new and used, the renting of trucks and automobiles under what is commonly termed the "U Drive It" system, and the doing of all acts necessary and customary in conducting a business of such character, as generally allowed by the laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars,  
payable in cash.

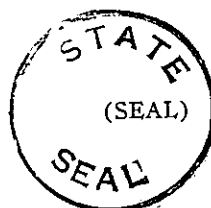
SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is twenty-five hundred (2500) Dollars,  
of the par value of One (\$1.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 31st day of October, 19 46, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:  
Otis F. Dugger, C. G. Milling and Lillian Smolen

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Otis F. Dugger  
as Vice-President, C. G. Milling; as Secretary, Lillian Smolen  
as Treasurer, C. G. Milling

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, \_\_\_\_\_, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
