THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

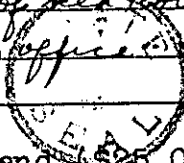

as Treasurer, James C. Anderson

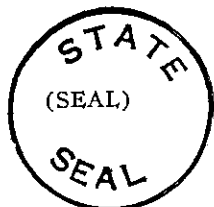
