WHEREAS, D. H. BOUCHILLON and J. R. HUTCHENS
both of Greenville, S.C.,

did on the 29th day of January, 1947 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is
SANS SOUCI LAUNDRY & CLEANERS

THIRD: That the principal place of business is
GREENVILLE, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is a general dry-cleaning and laundry business and work incident thereto as repairing, pressing, dyeing, washing, ironing, starching, marking, sorting, for the general public in its own or a trade name and to sell services pertaining to coats, aprons, towels and other linens, and to acquire good will, rights and property and the whole or any part of the assets and liabilities of any person, firm or corporation and to pay for the same in cash, stocks or bonds of this corporation or otherwise; to enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind for any lawful purpose without limit as to amount and do all things incident to the proper management, maintenance and expansion of such business and to have and to exercise all powers conferred by the laws of South Carolina in corporations formed under the laws thereof.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars,

payable immediately to the extent of twenty (20%) per cent or more.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred (200) Dollars.
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 27th day of January, 1947, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

D. H. Bouchillon, J. R. Hutchens and M. L. Polk

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President D. H. Bouchillon
as Vice-President, J. R. Hutchens; as Secretary, J. R. Hutchens
as Treasurer, M. L. Polk

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
