FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is ST. JOHN MANUFACTURING CO., INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is manufacturing and wholesale distribution of cotton garments, rayon garments, plastic garments, woman and children's wear, and other commodities of similar type and nature; also, engage in the business commonly known as converting of cotton and rayon goods.

of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

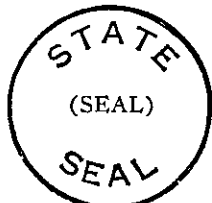
SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 30th day of January, 1947,

as Vice-President, Edward M. St. John; as Secretary, J. F. Perley
as Treasurer, Dan W. Cochran

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in.....
