WHEREAS, H. Devar Burbage, James H. Stroud, C. L. Scott,
James C. Gould, Sidney M. Wilson and J. LaRue Hinson,
all of Greenville, S. C.,

did on the 25th day of March, 1947, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is PALMETTO GARMENT COMPANY, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to manufacture, buy, sell, and to engage in, conduct, and carry on the business of manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in goods, wares and merchandise of every class and description and to do any and all other acts allowed by corporations under the laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars,
payable in money and property.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is 1100, of which 100 shall be Preferred Stock of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, and 1000 shall be Common stock of the par value of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

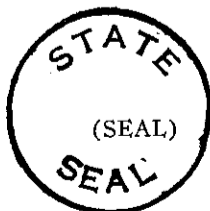
SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 24th day of March, 1947, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:
H. Devar Burbage, James H. Stroud and C. L. Scott.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President H. Devar Burbage
as Vice-President, James H. Stroud; as Secretary, James H. Stroud
as Treasurer, H. Devar Burbage.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
