in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said P. L. Farrow, his heirs and assigns, forever: All of my undivided right, title and interest in and to all that certain tract or parcel of land situate in Paris Mountain Township, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, containing fifty-seven and fifty one-hundredths (57.50) acres, more or less, designated as tract number one (1) on a plat made by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, dated March, 1947, bounded on the Northeast by lands of Blakeney, on the Southeast by lands of W. L. Farrow, on the Southwest by tract number two (2) of said plat and on the Northwest by lands of W. C. Davis, said tract of land being one-half of the tract of 113 acres, more or less, conveyed by C. J. Moody to I. D. Farrow and P. L. Farrow by deed dated April 24, 1946, and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance of the County of Greenville, South Carolina, in Vol. 293, at page 443.
